B.E.S.

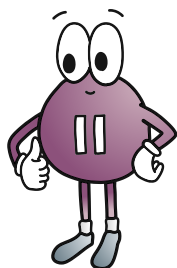

Q

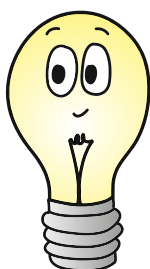

The Bible isn't just one book - it's more like a whole library! Inside, you will find history, letters, poems, songs, stories, parables (which are special kinds of lessons told through stories) and a book about the future.

The Bible has two big parts: the Old Testament and the New Testament. More than 40 different people wrote it, and it took about 1,500 years to finish! In this booklet, you'll get to learn some cool and surprising facts about what's inside the Bible, who wrote it, and its amazing history.

FACT FILE

- The very first Bibles were written in Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek - not English!
- The Bible is important not only to Christians, but parts of it are also special to people who follow Judaism and Islam.
- The Bible has two main parts. The Old Testament (before Jesus was born) and the New Testament (after Jesus was born).
- The first four books of the New Testament - Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John - are called the Gospels and tell the story of Jesus' life.
- Genesis is the very first book of the Bible, and it tells the story of how God made the world in the beginning!
- The last book of the Bible is called Revelation, and it tells about the future, the battle between good and evil, and Jesus coming back.

Have you ever built something - a LEGO tower, a sandcastle, or even a fort? Did it stay strong, or did it fall apart? Jesus once told a parable about two men who built houses. At first, both houses looked good on the outside. But one builder was wise, and the other was foolish.

A parable is a story about ordinary, everyday things but with a deeper meaning about God and His ways.

The wise builder dug deep and built his house on solid rock. He knew that a house needed to have a good foundation to make it strong. When a strong storm came with rushing water, the house did not shake. The house stood firm because it was well built. It did not fall down.

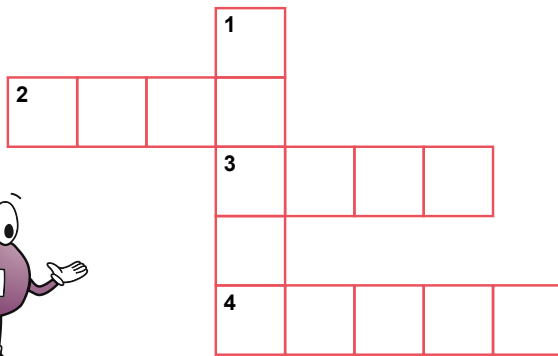
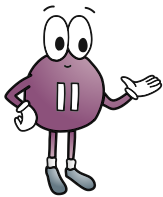

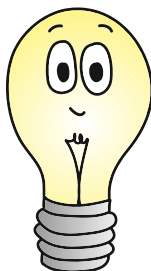

Luke 8: 22-25



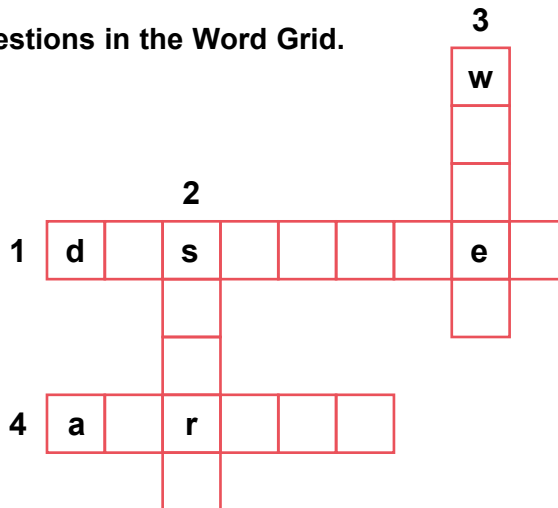

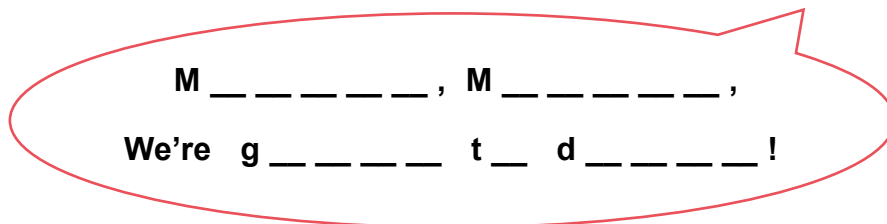

Have you ever seen someone who needed help and wondered, "Should I stop and help them?" That's the big question in one of Jesus' most famous stories - the Parable of the Good Samaritan. Jesus told this story to show us that our neighbour isn't just the person who lives next door. A neighbour is anyone who needs our help, no matter who they are. So, let's explore this parable and discover what it means to be kind, caring, and truly loving to others.

One day, a man asked Jesus what he must do to live the way God wants. Jesus answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind."

A few nights after Jesus came to Jerusalem, He ate a special supper with His disciples. He knew this would be the last time they would eat together before He died. After that, Jesus went to a garden to pray. While He was there, His enemies came with clubs and swords to arrest Him. Sadly, one of Jesus' disciples, Judas, helped them to find Him.

The next day, the men who wanted Jesus to be put to death brought Him to Pilate, the Governor. He asked Jesus many questions but could not find that Jesus had done anything wrong. “Crucify Him! Crucify Him!” the crowd yelled at the top of their voices. Three times, Pilate tried to tell them that Jesus had done no wrong, but in the end, he did what the crowd wanted and sentenced Jesus to death.
