B.E.S.

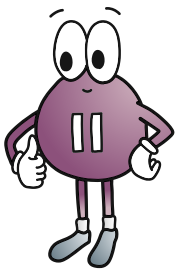

Q

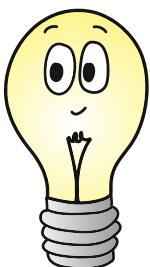

The word Bible means library. The Bible is a large collection of books divided into two parts, the Old Testament and the New Testament. The Bible gives much information about the life and ministry of Jesus.

FACT FILE ABOUT THE BIBLE

- The books of the Bible were written over a period of about 1,500 years by many different authors.
- The writing of the books of the New Testament was completed by the end of the first century AD.
- Most of the Old Testament was originally written in Hebrew and all of the New Testament in Greek.
- There are 7,957 verses in the New Testament.
- The twenty seven books of the New Testament are divided into four groups:
 - 4 Gospels
 - 1 book of history
 - 21 books of letters (or epistles)
 - 1 book about the future
- The records about the life of Jesus are in the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John).

LESSON 2: The meaning of Christmas

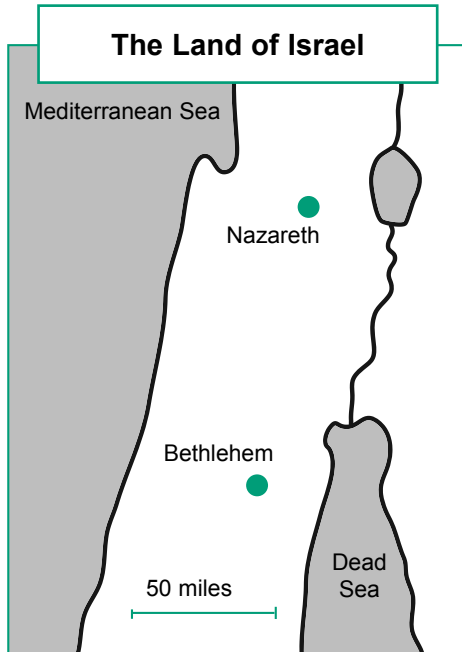
The Birth of Jesus

Here we see the miracle of the first Christmas! Christians believe that Jesus is God's Son; His mother was Mary but His father was God! Mary had been visited by the angel Gabriel, who told her that she was going to be the mother of Jesus.

God had said that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem, but Mary and Joseph lived in Nazareth, 70 miles away. When the Roman Emperor, Caesar Augustus, decided to take a census and count how many people lived in the empire, he was helping to work out God's plan, without knowing it! Mary and Joseph had to go to Bethlehem to register for the census, and while they were there the baby was born.

The Parable of the Good Samaritan



Who is your neighbour? Have you ever seen someone who needed help, and then had to decide whether to stop and help them? That's the big question behind one of Jesus' most famous stories: the Parable of the Good Samaritan.



READ:
Luke 10: 25-37

One day, a man asked Jesus, "What must I do to live the way God wants?" Jesus replied by telling a story about a man who was hurt and left on the side of the road. Many people walked by without helping, but someone unexpected, a Samaritan, stopped to care for him. This was surprising because Jews and Samaritans didn't usually get along.

Through this story, Jesus teaches us a powerful lesson: our neighbour isn't just the person who lives next door, it's anyone who needs our help, no matter who they are.

Let's explore this parable and think about what it means to be kind, caring, and truly loving to others.
